From the Bunkhouse: Coyotes

When we first moved into Agua Caliente, no one had lived there on a regular basis for some time. We found that we had a problem with coyotes in our front yard. They came right up to the house and seemed unafraid of humans. This happened every night. As we had both dogs and cats, we felt that it

was dangerous to have coyotes so close to the house. When we found that yelling at them did not seem to scare them, we had to find another way to discourage them. We found that by going out in the front yard and firing a shotgun in the air scared the coyotes out of the yard. We did this for two months and

soon the coyotes did not come up to the house anymore.
